Bowes Museum, Newgate, Barnard Castle DL12 8NP

Using Cumbria Classic Coach Heritage Route 572 bus to Barnard Castle via Middleton-in-Teasdale leaving Kirkby Stephen Market Square (Pennine Hotel) 10.45, and request bus to stop at Bowes Museum, arriving approx. 12.30. "Now" cards accepted. Free parking. Free time for an hour and a half for lunch in the acclaimed Bowes Café (service can be slow so do this on arrival) menu online or bring a picnic lunch to eat on the bus or in the museum grounds, with some time to look around some of this wonderful, large museum.

At 14.00 prompt the famous Silver Swan automaton, on the 2nd floor, will sing for 40 seconds. We then meet Dr Coutts, Keeper of Ceramics on the 2nd floor for a special tour of the newly-refurbished ceramic displays, starting at 14.15 prompt. The tour will finish at 15.15, and our bus arrives at 15.35 to pick us up and take us back to Kirkby Stephen for 16.15.

Hartley Medieval Farms

Dales Countryside Museum, Hawes, DL8 3NT

Using Cumbria Classic Coach Heritage Route 569 leaving Kirkby Stephen (Pennine Hotel) 10.45 arriving Hawes 12.00 which gives us a good time to have lunch in the new museum Firebox Cafe and look round the museum returning by bus from outside the museum 15.10 home 16.10 (alternative times from elsewhere in Hawes). "Now" cards accepted. Pay and display parking at the museum car park.

This museum is housed in the former Hawes railway station and shows the story of the Dales and its people through artefacts including the old Doctor's Surgery interior from Brough.

There will also be a temporary exhibition 'In the Footsteps of Turner' celebrating the bicentenary of J.M. Turner's visit to the Yorkshire Dales featuring the work of Jo Hume and Debbie Loane.

The Museum of North Craven Life, The Folly, Victoria Street, Settle BD24 9EY

This is an ideal opportunity to travel on the Settle-Carlisle railway and enjoy the journey including the exceptional Ribbleshead Viaduct and scenery to Settle.

Railway information when going to print - leave Kirkby Stephen Station 9.48, arrive 10.31 return 15.45, Kirkby Stephen 16.29. Please note that there is a change of train operator on 1st April and a timetable review in May, please check times before departure. Discounts available with railcards, booking in advance and parties. We will go straight to the museum on arrival, 7 minute walk.

The recently restored Listed Grade I building, The Folly, was built in 1679 by Richard Preston and houses the museum. Standing by the old main road into the town, his house formed the centrepiece of his estate in Settle and was undoubtedly built to make an impact.

The museum tells the story of Settle and North Craven district including the Settle – Carlisle Railway. There are new exhibitions for 2016. '1916: Chronicles of Courage', people from Settle serving in the First World War and 'The end of an era: 200 years of Zion Chapel'. The Zion Chapel now closed was in Upper Settle and this exhibition also looks at how the chapel affected the lives of its worshippers. Wheelchair access to ground floor and first floor only.

Entrance fee concession £2.30 please book so we can advise numbers.

Afterwards, lunch and looking around Settle. Tuesday is market day in Settle with a street market dating back to 1248 plus an indoor market in the Victoria Hall.
